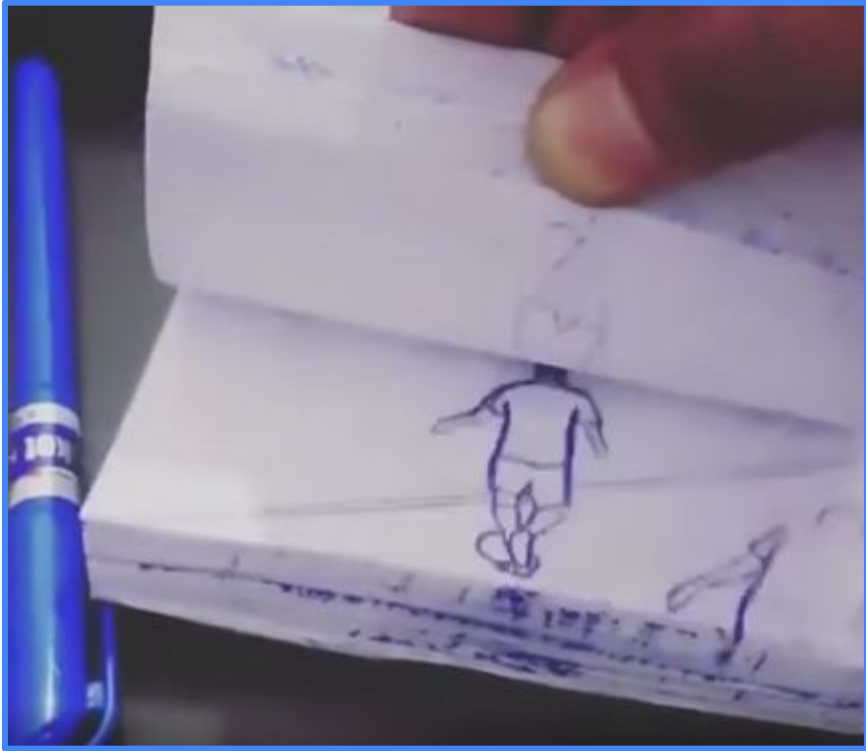

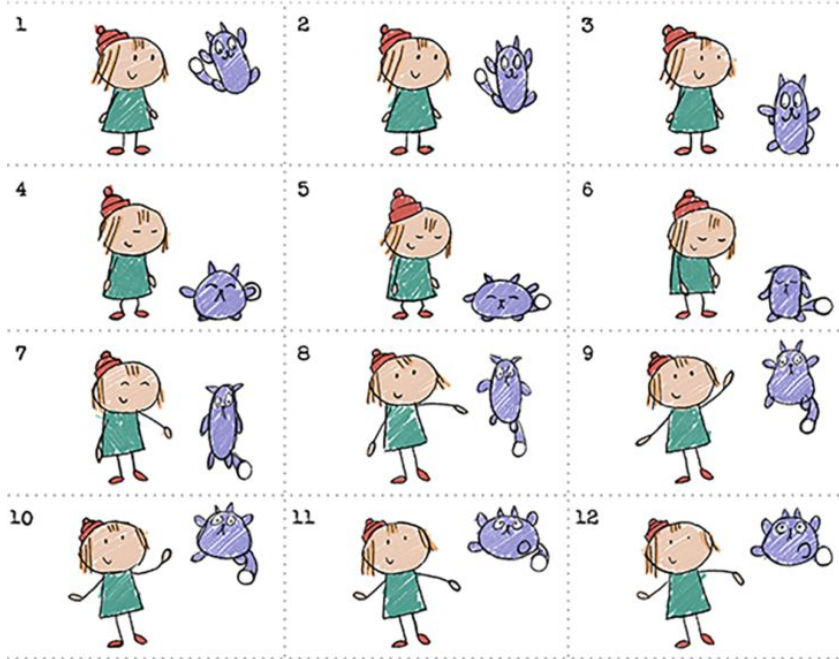

What Is A Flipbook?

A flip-book is a small book with images on each page that change slightly, so that when you quickly flip through the pages of the book it gives the illusion of movement or animation.

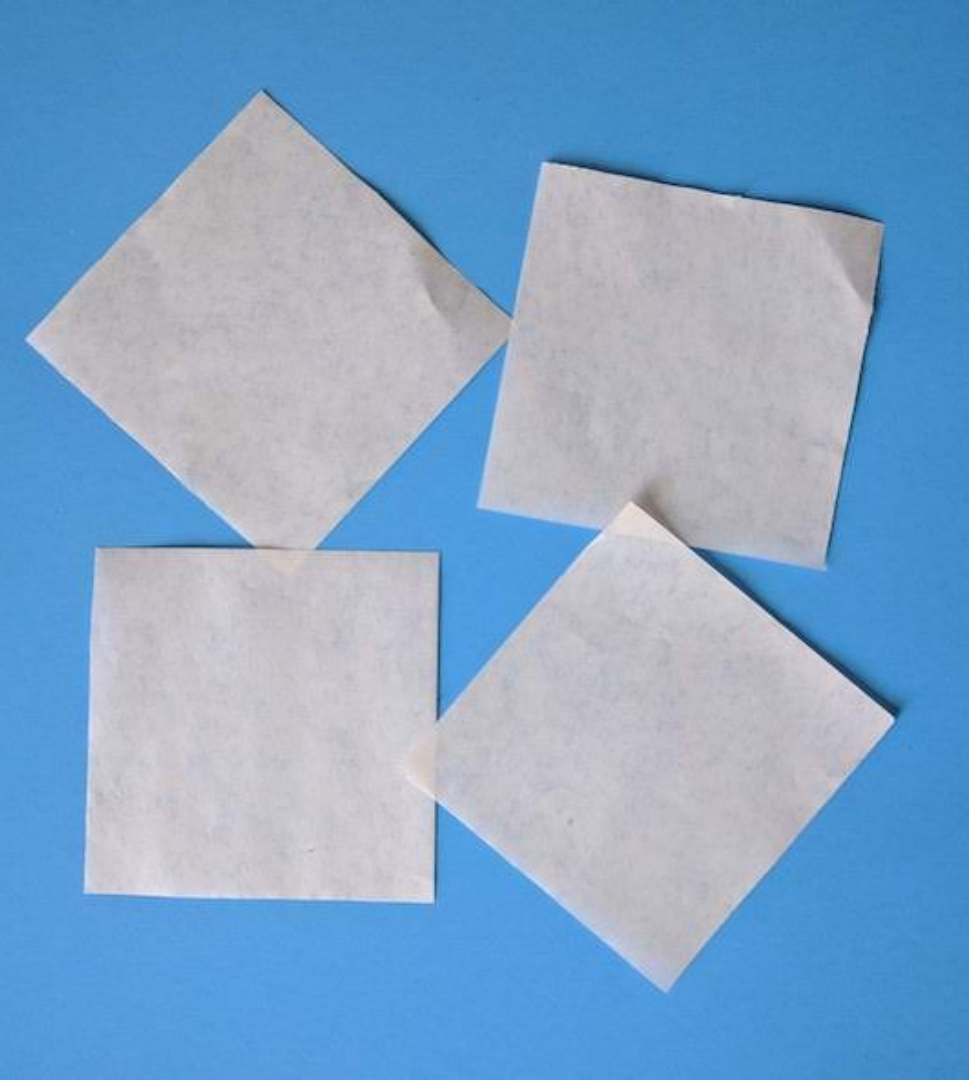


**We will use our

Flipbook Animation**



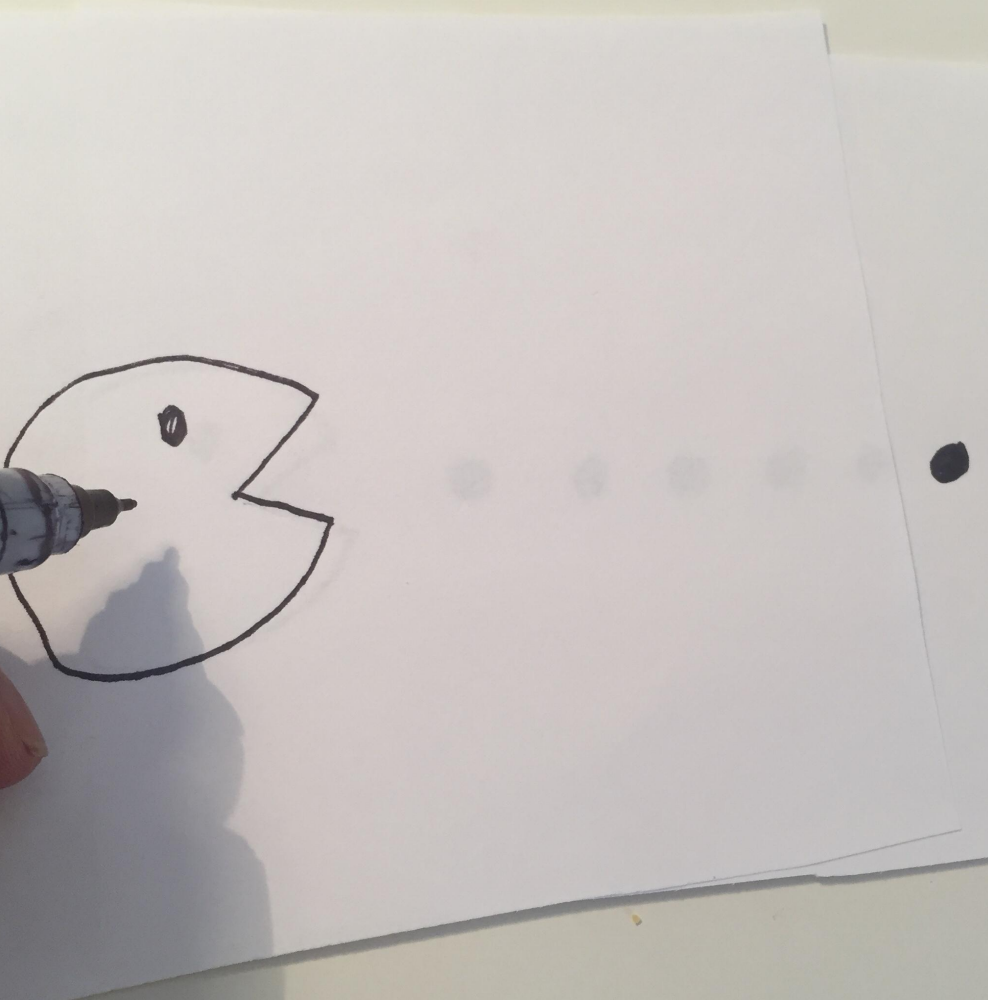
Step 1:

Highlight a frame in your storyboard that you would like to animate.



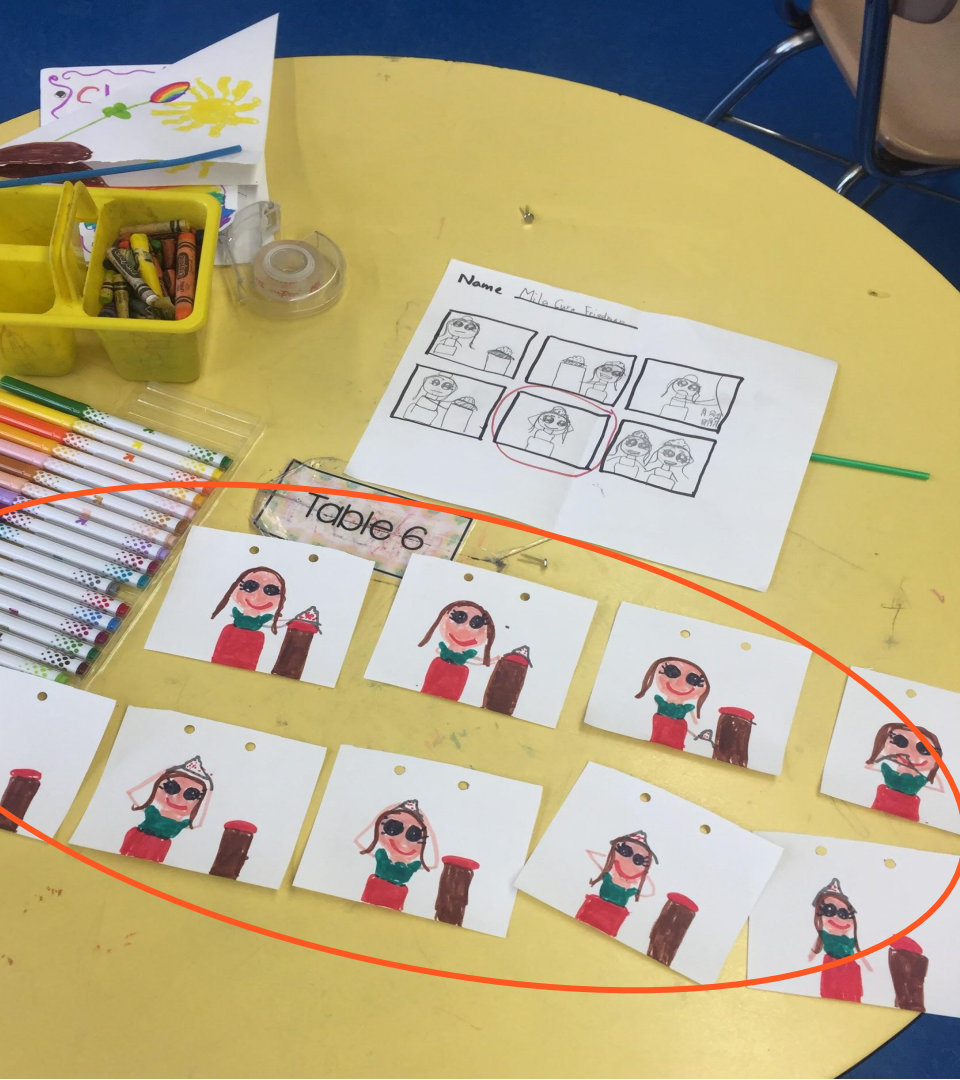
Step 2:

Cut paper into your desired size. Hand-held sizes in rectangles or squares are ideal because it's easier to flip the book's pages quickly and get the desired animation effect. Stack your paper when finished.



Step 3:

Draw an image on the bottom sheet of your paper stack. This will be your first sequence in your Flipbook Animation!



Step 4:

Draw the same image on the next sheet of paper by tracing your first one. But this time, be sure to make a slight change from your previous image. This will help to animate your flipbook. Repeat until you have at least 8 frames.



Step 5:

Hold your drawings together and flip through to see them animated!
