# CLOSE TO HOME

September 5 - October 29, 1996

Beginning September 5, Lehman College Art Gallery will present **CLOSE TO HOME**, a group exhibition relating to domestic life. The exhibition will include:

**Steven Brower, Esperanza Cortes, Taylor Davis, Ellen Driscoll, Lisa Hoke, Nene Humphrey, Sally Minker, Michael Pribich, Rhonda Roland Shearer, Jeanne Tremel, and Bettina Werner.**

The exhibition catalogue will contain an essay by Lehman College Prof. Patricia J. Thompson, a feminist theorist and authority on the changing American family. *Finding Meanings in the Everyday World Around Us*, a talk by Barbara M. Kelly, Curator, Special Collections, Hofstra University will be presented in cooperation with the City and Humanities Program on Friday, September 28 at 12:15. There will be a reception for the exhibition on Tuesday, October 1, from 5:00 to 7:00 pm. The public is invited to attend.

**CLOSE TO HOME** is an exhibition of large-scale installations, mixed media works, and drawings inspired by the poetry, labor, romance, and humor of life around the house. The exhibition ranges from Sally Minker's frenetic parody, *The High Anxiety Living Room* to Steven Brower's small-scale replica of Frank Lloyd Wright's Robie House fashioned from Domino's Pizza boxes—from Lisa Hoke's Zen meditations weighted by objects to Jeanne Tremel's two-dimensional works fashioned from scouring pads, dental floss, and twist ties. In this exhibition eleven artists examine the heroic and the mundane from daily life.
